In last month's newsletter, I shared with you what a wonderful gift of the Lion and the Lamb that Jesus has represented for us. As I was finishing up writing my sermon for Palm Sunday, I couldn't help but think of what a wonderful gift Jesus gave of himself for us. So much so I pondered in what ways we are giving of ourselves to be more like Him?

I think back to the many years of collecting maple sap from trees, trudging through snow, hauling buckets, constantly managing the fire to produce a desirable level of heat to evaporate off the water without burning the sugar dissolved in it. It also is a servant ministry for me, through me showing humility to serve others without receiving anything in return by me showing others love and compassion as Jesus would for us. It is my prayer that the maple syrup that I freely offered after last Sunday's worship service reminds each of you of the sweetest grace of all that is afforded to each of us at no cost.

In the presence of such a gift for all of us, all we can do is to wonder at the amazement of it all. Take that feeling of amazement and share it with someone. Also, take a look at what you surround yourself with in your life and ask God in prayer just what he wants you to do with it to change this world. In Matthew 19:29, it reads:

"And everyone who has given up houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or property, for my sake, will receive a hundred times as much in return and will inherit eternal life."

While I am not a financial investment advisor, I can tell you that the return on investment on that decision is out of this world, and that's the whole point of it: why not give of your time and talents? Ask God in prayer just what he wants you to do with them to change this world.


