*CALL TO WORSHIP

L: When we move from one place to another, we often find that we must purchase new curtains, or new rugs, or even new furniture, to fit in the new place. Why, then, do we not find new ways of doing things when we move from one circumstance in life to another?

L: We need not change simply for the sake of change. It is good to know our histories, for that is how we come to know ourselves. However, sometimes we need to change because what worked in the past no longer works. Nobody would wear the same size shoes for their entire life because the shoes would no longer fit. Why do we think that the same worship style we used as a child is the best fit for us as adults?

P: Lord, teach us to retain the meat of Your unending message, but to replace the old and worn-out traditions which have become meaningless through overuse and have led to complacency and rote routines, rather than to meaningful communion with You.
