

I must say that it has been a very busy time around the church. Vic and Sharon Vanderville, plus all their helpers (Gordie Barry, John Livingston, Ted Burson, Lynn and Jack LaRose, Candace Haskell, Pastor B.J. and Rick Cole (Pastor B.J.'s neighbor)) have been very busy building new steps to the pastor's office from outside the back entrance. They have been equally busy widening the door to his office so those in wheelchairs can access that office. Vic and Sharon installed new wainscoting around the new door so that the area blends in perfectly with the existing building. Jack and Lynn also donated the wainscoting, which makes me wonder if there is anything on earth that someone in this congregation doesn't have somewhere in an attic or a storage shed. I don't think wainscoting has been popular for at least a few dozen years, yet it fits perfectly in this old church building! (Does anybody happen to have a bundle board in some spare corner? Just wondering: I don't really have use for one.) In addition to all the upkeep and repairs and sprucing up, the church has been decorated beautifully by many of these same people plus a few more. The UMW women had a very fine Christmas tea/luncheon/cookie exchange/white elephant exchange/ social event. They couldn't invite guests from the other churches in town because of continuing concerns about that nasty COVID stuff, but they managed to celebrate with joy and thanksgiving for all they have received this past year. This church even participated in a virtual Festival of Lessons and Carols, as Pastor B.J. recorded Penny Tracy and Connie Kelsey as they read scripture passages, Dan Kelsey as he sang a beautiful rendition of *O* Holy Night, and a make-shift choir, who also sang Christmas carols. Our contribution was combined with contributions from the other churches in the community, and the Festival was broadcast on-line for all to see. One of the responsibilities of a lay leader is to serve as a liaison between the clergy and the laity of the church. In some churches this can be a very difficult job because of ongoing friction between the two groups. In this church, we are blessed with the cooperation we have between the clergy and the laity. It is a pleasure to work with such a dedicated and giving church family. We are looking forward to what the new year will bring. Certainly we will continue to have challenges; COVID still rears its ugly head in ever new strains. Certainly we will continue to be involved in maintaining this old church building so that it remains a safe, attractive, and convenient place in which to worship and work to carry out the Great Commission. Above all, we are certainly blessed to have such a willing, committed, and dedicated church staff and membership working together as a team to continue the work of First United Methodist Church in Manistique throughout the coming year and well into the future.
