***CALL TO WORSHIP**

L: In Cana in Galilee, Jesus performed his first miracle, that of turning water into wine at a wedding.

P: Is this not a little thing? Why would Jesus, who could even raise the dead from the grave, waste time changing water into wine just so people could have more to drink? Couldn't they drink water when the wine ran out?

L: Jesus cares about people. He knew the embarrassment the family would suffer if the wine ran out. We know that there is no problem too big for Jesus to handle, but do we assume that there are problems which are too small for him?

P: Should we then take even little problems which we can solve ourselves to God?

L: God knows whether or not we can solve the problems ourselves. He also knows when his intervention can use a small matter to work a great good, and when we should solve it ourselves. He will act according to his will and our need. Why do we feel comfortable in discussing minor matters with our friends but not with God.

P: O Lord, let us see you as our friend who cares even about our small concerns, rather than as a powerful master who cares only about major concerns, and give us the will to call on you for all that we encounter in our lives.
