

"April showers bring May flowers." "If March comes in like a lion, it goes out like a lamb." "A swarm of bees in May, is worth a load of hay." 

## **Trustee Update**

The trustees continue to work on a variety of areas for our church:

- Plan an upcoming Spring Work Day sometime in May.
- Replace the basement windows and repair the trim.
- We continue to work on the policies of the church in the areas of Building Use, Sexual Abuse/ Safe Space, and Intruder/Emergency Action Plan. These are concerns to which most churches have given serious thought, and for which they have developed an action plan.
- Finish the rear exterior stairwell project we began last October. •
- We are also looking into adding AC to the building.
- The trustees continue to gather information the options, cost and feasibility of adding a steeple to the church.
- We are waiting on the final shipment of replacement ovens for the kitchen. The last word was some time in June.
- Another idea that has come to the attention of the trustees is to look into adding a restroom on the main floor. We are checking with the building inspector to see the codes and cost for the project.
- Working with our Vitality and Worship Ministry Areas, we are looking at ways we can share information of the church with everyone.

We have lots to do to help our church meet the needs of the congregation and ministries to which God is calling us.


