

#### Lay Leader Lines September, 2022

## Q: I heard that there was a District Conference at Camp Michigamme recently. Is that anything like the Michigan Annual Conference we hear about every year?

A: The District Conference is similar to the Michigan Annual Conference, in that it is where the business of the Northern Skies District is conducted. Because the District Conference pertains only to our own District rather than to all the Districts in the State Conference, there is less business to conduct. A budget is set for the District, local apportionments for each of the local churches are set, and any business which pertains to the District as a whole but not to the Conference is conducted. In addition, because Camp Michigamme is unique in that it is a District camp rather than a Conference camp, we adopt a budget for the camp itself. We also choose a Mission Project of the year, which has traditionally been a local church or Camp Michigamme. Local churches are asked to help provide support for some special need of the church which is chosen. In past years we have selected churches which were dealing with major expenses, such as the need to replace a failing roof or to remodel an area of the church which is not handicapped accessible. Somewhat surprisingly, no church has applied to be the mission church of the year for 2023. Camp Michigamme was the mission of the year recipient for 2022, and although a great deal of work has been done on the camp properties, there is still more work which needs to be completed. In particular, the showers are in need of replacement. One shower facility has showers which were installed in the 1940's. They no longer function adequately and have been repaired about as often as is possible. The total cost of the shower replacement is not yet settled but it appears that it may well be between \$250,000 and \$300,000. As a result, it was decided to name Camp Michigamme the mission church of the year again for 2023.

In addition to the business meeting, the attendees participated in a worship service, had a picnic lunch (in Grace Hall instead of outdoors because of the rain), brought books for a book exchange for those who wished to participate, and celebrated the 100th anniversary of the founding of Camp Michigamme. We also had time to wander around the campground. For those who remember what the camp was like many years ago, there have been many changes and improvements made over the past several years. As at any facility of "a certain age," there are always additional improvements which will be needed in future years. As a District rather than a Conference camp, Camp Michigamme does not receive Conference support. All funding is drawn from the District alone. Through the years the local churches have done well at keeping our camp

going. For many residents of the Upper Peninsula, Camp Michigamme is a very special place which has contributed a great deal to the faith development of those campers who have attended sessions there.
