PASTOR'S

For most people, this harvest time of the year heading into the holidays WORDS brings about a sense of gratefulness, a feeling of thanksgiving, and wanting to share in our abundance with one another. Corinthians 9:11

echoes this sentiment with "You will be enriched in every way to be generous in every way, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God." So, in our giving to one another, we give praise and thanksgiving to God. That reminds me of our upcoming Thanksgiving meal that we sponsor at Big Boy and the UMW assembling the Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes that we donate each year. We also gather for the Manistique Ministerial Association's ecumenical Thanksgiving service that will be held here in our church on Nov. 22 at 7 PM to celebrate the blessings that God has placed in our lives.

Don't let that anxiety prevent you from fulfilling God's blessings in our lives, but instead pray fervently that God's will be done.

Our upcoming family movie event on Nov. 5<sup>th</sup> is something brand new here, but we shouldn't let any anxiety prevent us from trying it. I also think about our long-term planning meetings and how we are organizing our efforts to be intentional about how we do ministry instead of being reactive like the "Whac-A-Mole" game.

When these things start falling into place, I am reminded of Matthew 6:21 that reads "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." I remember the great number of people that came through our

church during the Progressive Dinner, and I think about how great it will be to participate in the Festival of Lessons & Carols in person again on December 11<sup>th</sup> at 3 PM at St. Francis.

This time of year certainly is a time to take a look around us and see the great many blessings that God is working within each of us...and what each of us


