I DO KNOW IT WASN'T VERY NEIGHBORLY OF YOU!

For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment,

"You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

So, how do we show love to one another? There are many books written on the topic, including one that talks about the 5 love languages: gifts, acts of service, words of affirmation, quality time, and physical touch. Speaking of physical touch, yes, there will be times when we will step on one another's toes while attempting to show love, but that allows us the opportunity to ask for forgiveness and for the other person to grant us some grace as we have all been shown grace.

Forgiveness is an important part of relationships and also a part of showing love to one another. It can be difficult for us to give forgiveness at times. While I was at a conference last month in Dallas, we received some breaking news on March 30^{th} that the Vatican had repudiated the Doctrine of Discovery as being no longer a part of the Catholic faith.

For those unfamiliar with this doctrine from nearly 500 years ago, it allowed the conquest of the Americas with the blessing of the Catholic church at that time and also set a precedent for how our nation interpreted laws regarding who is allowed to own the land. This was further backed through the U.S. Supreme Court to justify the cultural and racial superiority over other groups including Native Americans and would also include African Americans through the Civil Rights movement and other minority groups.

With this repudiation being less than a month old, it's important for us to take the

PASTOR'S WORDS the time to understand the impacts that this will have on our culture today that has been shaped from our past history and how it will impact our future understanding of what our culture is. Over the past

several years we have heard about land acknowledgments taking place during our annual conference meetings which acknowledges that this land was originally the ancestral lands of Native people before they were displaced (exiled). So, how does this fit in with our church? Back to the forgiveness part: in order to receive forgiveness, you have to ask for it. We know that through God's gift to us with Jesus' work through the cross that we are already forgiven, but we still need to intentionally ask for it. Jesus summed up the greatest commandment of all: love God and love one another. As a part of loving one another is forgiving each other of our sins.

Land acknowledgments are a step on the forgiveness path, but there is much more work to be done to being in right relationship with a people that are still in exile today. As Christians, we too are from an exiled people that are in a foreign, dominant society where we oftentimes see the great need for more work to be done for the furthering of God's kingdom here on earth. Let us not forget the reason why we do the things we do and also be able to drown out the "noise" of this world's politics that don't align with our Christian way of life as it is written in the biblical teachings.


